EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The present report gives the results of the economic impact of the new performing arts centre located in Fredericton, New Brunswick. It uses an input-output model to estimate the impact of the of the expenditures of patrons and clients¹ to the new facility while in the Fredericton region (excluding the cost of admission or for goods and services purchased, to avoid double counting when these are taken into account in the operations expenditures), construction expenditures of the proposed new building (including land purchase and demolition of the old building), as well as of the projected operations of the new facility for 2017-18.

Results are sometimes presented for all of New Brunswick's counties, although mostly only for York as impacts in other counties were less important, the province as a whole and for the rest of Canada. Variables analyzed are increased sales, contribution to the gross domestic product (GDP), employment (in full time equivalent positions) and government revenues.

The summary of the economic impact are presented in Tables 1 to 4. The total economic impact is significant, both inside and outside the province. Table 1 focuses on recurring impacts, resulting from operations expenditures and from patrons and clients expenditures. In Table 2, we present the summary of the impact of the construction of the facility, which will not be recurring.

In Table 1, in addition to the result of our analysis which focuses on the economic impact of expenditures linked to the presence of the new Fredericton performing arts centre, we present the HST revenues from operations. Revenues are not directly included in our analysis, as it would be double counting since those revenues translate into expenditures through salaries, purchases, etc. This is not the case for HST revenues which are simply transferred to the provincial and federal governments. Consequently, we add these to government revenues resulting from the various expenditure category.

Note that the federal government will receive more than 600 thousand dollars per year in recurring revenues. For the New Brunswick government, it is nearly 700 thousand dollars in recurring revenues that it will receive.

¹ In our analysis, we combine the impact of patrons and clients. These are distinct categories, where patrons purchase tickets and attend events as consumers while clients pertain to organizations and groups who rent the facility to stage their events.

INTRODUCTION

This study presents an economic impact of the new Fredericton performing arts centre. After having presented our methodology, we first present the impacts of the construction of the new proposed centre, including land purchase and the demolition of the old building. This is followed by the presentation of the impacts of the projected operations expenditure for the year 2017-18. This is followed by the presentation of the impact of the expenditures of patrons and clients. Finally, we present the total impact, adding the impacts of the three selected components.

The analysis includes direct, indirect and induced impacts. The direct impact is directly generated by the activity studied. As for indirect and induced impacts, they are combined in the present analysis, and presented as "indirect impacts". These represent the impacts, once the initial – or direct – impact has been made. For example, the salary received by a construction worker is a direct impact, while the expenditure by that worker, at the local grocery store, for repairs to his truck or for a trip to Florida would be considered indirect and induced impacts.

The study focuses on four variables. The first is sales generated. This can be interpreted as the purchase of a good or a service and represents the cost of paying for this good or service. The second category represents employment, measured in full time equivalent (FTE). For example, 4 persons each working 13 weeks, for a total of 52 weeks, represent a FTE. The third category is the contribution to the gross domestic product (GDP). GDP measures production, and is different from sales. For example, a carpenter who purchases \$40 of wood to produce a chair which he sells \$100 has contributed \$60 to the GDP, the difference between the cost of his inputs and the value of his output. Finally, the analysis estimates total government revenues for the federal government, the New Brunswick government and other provincial governments.

1. METHODOLOGY

The objective of the study is to quantify the total economic impact of the proposed new facility. As indicated in the previous section, the total economic impact includes direct, indirect and induced impacts. The latter are combined and presented as "indirect impacts".

An analysis like this one can only be done using a proven economic model, in this case an input-output model. The principle behind the input-output model is essentially to "follow the money path." For example, widgets used by a plant will be purchased from another plant, which in turn may offer its employees more work which in turn will increase their expenditures, leading them to pay more taxes, etc. The input-output model incorporates all these components. The model is also augmented by a number of econometric modules which are used to make the model more accurate. For the input-output analysis, data was supplied by the Fredericton Playhouse.

An important characteristic of the input-output model used is that it reflects the specificities of the New Brunswick economy, rather than applying national characteristics to the province's economy. This means that we do not simply use multipliers for the sector based on national averages. We thus input in the model detailed expenditures and use the input-output model to estimate the impact based on the true characteristics of New Brunswick's economy. Furthermore, results are available on a county basis.

We have had to make assumptions with respect to the expenditures of patrons and clients. We have made conservative estimates. We also estimated that the distribution of these patrons and clients (local, elsewhere in New Brunswick and outside New Brunswick) would remain the same. Note that the impact of the expenditures of local patrons and clients only include implicitly the expenditures directly linked to assisting at events at the

new facility, as expenditures for meals, for example, would take place whether a local patron attended the event or not.

Finally, we need to advise the reader that such an analysis aims to present a relatively accurate picture of the situation but one should always be reminded that the results should be interpreted with caution: they probably do not offer an "exact" measure of the impacts, but rather an "acceptable approximation". We are very confident that the present study is no exception and that it does present a very good measure of the economic impact of the new Fredericton performing arts centre.

2. CONSTRUCTION


2.1. SALES (EXPENDITURES) GENERATED

Sales generated by the construction of the proposed new Fredericton performing arts centre will total more than 141 million dollars³ (Table 3). The direct sales will be 42.7 million dollars. Indirect sales will be worth 52.4 million dollars in New Brunswick and an additional 46.2 million dollars of sales in provinces other than New Brunswick.

Focusing on where more precisely will take place the impact of the construction expenditures of on sales, we find (Figure 1) that a total of more than 77 million dollars will take place in York county. Nevertheless, other regions of the province benefit in additional sales. The total impact in other counties is nearly 18 million dollars.



2.2. EMPLOYMENT




Turning our attention to employment creation (Table 4, Figure 2), it is estimated that the total impact of construction expenditures will be 714.7 full time equivalent (FTE)⁴. 423 FTE positions will be directly created in York county, and a further 88.2 FTE positions will be created in New Brunswick as a result of indirect impacts. 203.5 FTE positions will also be created indirectly in other provinces.

2.3. GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT




The expenditure linked to the new Fredericton performing arts centre will add more than 40.2 million dollars to New Brunswick's GDP⁵ (Table 5). An additional 18.1 million dollars in GDP will be generated in other provinces, for a total of more than 58 million dollars. As will be the case for sales and employment, within New Brunswick, the impact will mostly be located in York region, but is not insignificant in other regions of the province (Figure 3).

2.4. GOVERNMENT REVENUES

Total government revenues generated by the construction of the new Fredericton performing arts centre will be nearly 10.5 million dollars⁶ (Figure 4). The federal government will see revenues increased by 4.9 million dollars and the New Brunswick government by nearly 3.9 million dollars. Other provincial government, as a result of indirect impacts in provinces other than New Brunswick, will have revenues of nearly 1.6 million dollars.

3. OPERATIONS (ANNUALLY RECURRING)

In section 3, we present the economic impact of operations expenditures projected for 2017-18 by the new Fredericton performing arts centre. These impacts are annually recurring, keeping in mind that the dollar amounts should increase to reflect inflation.


3.1. ANNUALLY RECURRING SALES (EXPENDITURE) GENERATED

Operations expenditures will generate 7.5 million dollars in sales in New Brunswick and an additional 3.5 million in other provinces for a total of 11 million dollars⁷ (Table 6). As was the case previously, a high percentage of the impact takes place in York, with some impact in all regions of the province (Figure 5).


3.2. ANNUALLY RECURRING EMPLOYMENT

Employment linked to projected operations expenditures will total the equivalent of 47.3 FTE positions in New Brunswick and an additional 16.3 FTE positions in other provinces for a total of 63.7 FTE positions⁸ (Table 7). The majority of employment creation would take place in York (Figure 6).


3.3. GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT

Projected operations expenditures of the new facility will contribute 3 million dollars to the province's GDP and an additional 1.4 million dollars to the GDP of other provinces⁹ (Table 8). Again, most of the impact within New Brunswick will take place in York (Figure 7).



3.4. GOVERNMENT REVENUES

Projected operations expenditures will generate more than 264 thousand dollars to the Federal government's coffers and more than 226 thousand dollars in the New Brunswick government's coffers¹⁰. As a result of the indirect impacts of the operation of the proposed Fredericton performing arts centre, other provincial governments received 137 thousand dollars in revenues.

4. PATRONS AND CLIENTS


Section 4 presents the economic impact of the expenditures of patrons and clients of the new Fredericton performing arts centre. Again, these impacts are annually recurring

4.1. ANNUALLY RECURING SALES (EXPENDITURE) GENERATED

The expenditures of patrons and clients of the new facility will generate 2.8 million dollars in sales in New Brunswick and an additional 1.7 million in other provinces for a total of 4.5 million dollars¹¹ (Table 9). As was the case previously, a high percentage of the impact takes place in York (Figure 9).


4.2. EMPLOYMENT

Employment linked to the expenditures of patrons and clients of the new facility will total the equivalent of 29.9 FTE positions in New Brunswick and an additional 8.1 FTE positions in other provinces for a total of 38 FTE positions¹² (Table 10). The majority of employment creation would take place in York (Figure 10).


4.3. GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT

The expenditures of patrons and clients of the new Fredericton performing arts centre will contribute nearly 1.2 million dollars to the province's GDP and an additional 690 thousand dollars to the GDP of other provinces¹³ (Table 11). Again, most of the impact within New Brunswick would take place in York (Figure 11).



4.4. GOVERNMENT REVENUES

The expenditures of the new facility's patrons and clients will generate nearly 145 thousand dollars to the Federal government's coffers and nearly 150 thousand dollars in the New Brunswick government's coffers¹⁴. As a result of the indirect impacts of the expenditures of patrons and clients, other provincial governments would receive 64 000 thousand in revenues.




5. TOTAL ECONOMIC IMPACT OF ANNUALLY RECURRING ACTIVITIES

Section 5 presents the total economic of the new Fredericton performing arts centre, which is the sum of the impacts of patrons and clients' expenditures and operations.

5.1. SALES (EXPENDITURE) GENERATED




Sales generated will total 10.3 million dollars in New Brunswick, mostly in the Fredericton (York) region, and more than 5.2 million dollars in the other Canadian provinces (Table 12 and Figure 13).

5.2. EMPLOYMENT

Total annually recurring employment created in New Brunswick will be 77.3 FTE position (Table 15), most of it taking place in York (Figure 14).



5.3. GROSS DOMESTIC PRODUCT



Total contribution to the province's GDP will be more than 4 million dollars and an additional 2 million dollars to the GDP of other provinces (Table 14). Most of the impact within New Brunswick would take place in York (Figure 15).

5.4. GOVERNMENT REVENUES

Total annually recurring revenues for governments will be significant. It will be more than 600 thousand dollars in Federal government revenues, nearly 700 thousand dollars in provincial government revenues and nearly 200 thousand dollars to the revenues of other provincial governments (Figure 16).



6. CONCLUSION

The report presents the estimations of the economic impact of the new Fredericton performing arts centre, focusing on the construction of the new facility, operations expenditures and expenditures by patrons and clients.

We must remind the reader that such an analysis aims to present a relatively accurate picture of the situation but one should always be reminded that the results should be interpreted with caution: they probably do not offer an "exact" measure of the impacts, but rather an "acceptable approximation". We are very confident that the present study is no exception and that it does present a very good measure of the economic impact of the new Fredericton performing arts centre.
